4. 'INAUGURATION OF CHEMICAL SOCIETY 2022-23'

Date: 27th September 2022

Institute of Science, Nagpur had organized inauguration of their Chemical society on Tuesday 27th September, 2022. The program went synergistically with a poster competition as well as One-day workshop on 'Surfactants: making and solicitation'.

The program opened with ribbon cutting by the Chief guest, Dr. Nandkishor N. Karade, commemorating a new beginning in the form of this event. The anchors for the first half were Mr. Ayush Kusram and Ms. Anisha Labale, from M.Sc. I, who opened the program with their welcoming remarks. Chemical Society of Institute of Science, Nagpur had organized a 'Chem-Quest' consisting of Intercollegiate Quiz and Seminar Competition on 29th March 2023. The Quiz competition was held in Auditorium (Room no. 45) of the Institute of Science. The Quiz yield participation of 11 teams from various colleges such as PGTD, RTMNU, Shivaji Science, Kamla Nehru College, etc.

The Quiz competition had four severed rounds viz. Screening, Visual, Specialisation and Rapid fire. Specialization rounds had sub-rounds of subjects organic, inorganic, physical and analytical chemistry. Eight teams were selected from screening to play the Visual round. Four teams were selected from Visual to play specialization. The teams were named from members of first transition series elements. Team Scandium and Team Vanadium played the final rapid fire round. These teams were from the Institute of Science and PGTD, RTMNU. Team Scandium, of PGTD RTMNU emerged as the winner of the competition. The program concluded by enriching students with concepts and it's clarity as they faced the series of questions.

7. SEMINAR COMPETITION CONDUCTED BY CHEMICAL SOCIETY 2022-23

The chemical society under the department of science, Institute of science, Nagpur has organised the inter – collegiate seminar competition for PG students of chemistry on 29th march 2023, Wednesday.

The students were allowed to present their topic of seminar in the form of power point presentation. The topics for presentation of this competition were

To bring about awareness among students and society it's necessary to form such society and organize various programs related to environment and issues pertaining to it. Environmental education should


- (a) Be made compulsory, right from the primary up to the post graduate stage.

- (f) Lay more stress on practical activities and first hand experiences.


Committee of the Environmental Science Society has organized following Programs: 2022-23

The visit was organized by Ms. Shilpa Bhajani and Dr. Shubhangi Jangle. We were total 9 students. The aim of the visit is to understand and enhancethe knowledge of plastic recycle. This recycling unit has two plant one is located opposite to Sharda company in Kamptee and another one is located to Uppalwadi around 2 km form the first plant. Firstly, visited the first plant at Shaila Plastic and second unit was a pipe manufacturing unit named Indian Plastic.



3. Visit to Gorewada Park, Nagpur

The visit was arranged to Gorewada Park.Mr. Aniruddha Chaoji (Ran Mangli foundation) and Mr. Pandurang Pakhale (retired Assistant Conservator of forest, Nagpur) and Mr. Shubham Chaphekar (Biologist at Gorewada) guided us for the visit. We also studied fresh dropping of Nilgai. Aniruddha Siralso imitated the calls of a few birds so that students get interested in seeing birds and gain knowledge about the same. Pakhale sir guided the students on careers in wildlife conservationand management.

The syllabus for B.Sc. 1, Semester 1 has two visits namely

- 1. Visit to water body to study Pond as an ecosystem.
- 2. Visit to Nearby Forest to study the flora and fauna in its Natural Environment.


Mrs. Praneti Lawange gave information about the history of Gorewada Lake and stratification of Lake Ecosystem. The visit was concluded at 10:30 am.

Faculty of our Department Dr. Anagha Patil Mam has given an Online Presentation regarding the Sparrows on 20th March. She has provided us immense knowledge about the Sparrows.

These devices collect data from weather event some distance from the instrument and typically stores the data and often transmit the data at defined interval to central data center.

Entire B.Sc.1st year along with MSc 2nd year students of Environmental Science department were present in the visit. And it was guided by our faculty Dr. Anagha Patil. We also seen the "Radiosonde" weather balloon.



8. Celebrating 50 years of Project Tiger








One Day Workshop - 23rd September, 2022 On

"Health Safety and Personality Development of Women"

1. Lecture on "Awareness about Cervical Cancer in Women" by Dr. Madhuri Gawande (Gynecologist)

One day workshop on "Health Safety and Personality Development of Women" started with the first Lecture of the workshop on "Awareness about Cervical Cancer in Women" by Dr. Madhuri Gawande, a leading and popular Obstetrics and Gynecologist in Nagpur having over twenty years of experience. In her power point presentation she highlighted the reasons and causes of cervical cancer, malign tumor of the cervix the lower most part of the uterus. She enlightened the students with the term PAP test for pre cancer cell changes on the cervix that might become cervical cancer if are not treated appropriately. She focused that most cervical cancers are associated with human Papilloma virus (HPV), a sexually transmitted infection therefore widespread immunization with the HPV vaccine could reduce the impact of cervical cancer and other cancers caused by HPV worldwide. She also informed about the HPV vaccination and recommended girls to go for it at the age of 11–12 years of age or even from 9 years of age as well. All preteens need HPV vaccination, so they are protected from HPV infections that can cause cancer later in life. Teens and young adults through age 26 years can also go for the HPV vaccination.










2. Lecture on "Self Defence of Women" by Mrs. Vijaya Wanjari (API)














PLANTATION DRIVE

Government Institute of Science Induction Program 2022: <u>A Week of Inspiration and Guidance</u>



Purvesh, Anuj, and Mandar, leaving a lasting memory of a remarkable beginning to the Induction Program.






Day 2





 year students including teachers, the competition was hosted by Mst. Manthan



Workshop on DTA-TGA

- Physics society organized a two-day workshop on DTA-TGA, the speaker of this workshop was Dr. R R Patil sir. He was welcome by our head of the department Dr. Chandragupta Dhudhe sir by give him a sapling. This workshop was held on 10th and 11th April 2023.
- DTA (Differential Thermal Analysis): determines endo- and exothermic event temperatures, and shows phase transitions. TGA (Thermogravimetric Analysis): determines decomposition/mass loss over a temperature range.
- Thermogravimetry Differential Thermal Analysis or TG/DTA is a simultaneous thermal analyzer that can characterize multiple thermal properties of a sample.
- The TG component measures temperatures where decomposition, reduction or oxidation occurs. It simultaneously measures the weight changes associated with decomposition, oxidation and any other physical or chemical changes that result in sample weight loss or gain. The DTA component shows whether decomposition processes are endothermic or exothermic. The DTA also measures temperatures corresponding to phase changes where no mass loss occurs, such as melting, crystallization and glass transitions. The "TG" of TG/DTA is very similar to standard thermogravimetric analysis (TGA). A TG/DTA measures the change in sample weight as a function of temperature (and/or time) under controlled gas atmosphere and temperature. Graphing the percent weight change over a programmed temperature range enables the study of physical or chemical processes that have caused the sample to lose or gain weight.

• Ideal Uses of TGA-DTA

- Thermal stability studies
- Monitoring mass changes of materials under controlled gas atmosphere and temperature: volatiles, reactive gas evaluation, filler content, compositional analysis, material identification
- Phase transitions of metals and alloys
- Qualitative analysis of phase transitions: melting, Tg, crystallization
- Determining the effect of oxidative or reductive atmospheres on materials
- Analysis of polymers, organic and inorganic materials

Strengths

- Rapid screening of thermal properties of materials
- Simultaneous acquisition of thermogravimetry and phase transition data
- Small sample size
- Choice of atmospheres (inert or reactive)
- Used for high temperature analysis of phase transitions

Limitations

- Does not measure heat capacity
- Not quantitative for enthalpy change (e.g., heat of fusion) measurement



Workshop on Rietveld Refinement

- Physics society organized a two-day workshop on Rietveld Refinement, the speaker
 of this workshop was Dr. U. A. Palikundwar sir. our head of the department Dr.
 Chandragupta Dhudhe sir welcomed by giving him a sapling. This workshop was held
 on 10th and 11th April 2023.
- Rietveld refinement is a technique devised by Hugo Rietveld for use in the characterisation of crystalline materials. The neutron and x-ray diffraction of powder samples results in a pattern characterised by peaks in intensity at certain positions. The height, width and position of these peaks can be used to determine many aspects of the materials structure.
- The Rietveld method uses a least squares approach to refine a theoretical line profile until it matches the measured profile. The introduction of this technique was a significant step forward in the diffraction analysis of powder samples as, unlike other techniques at that time, it was able to deal reliably with strongly overlapping reflections.
- It is advantageous to use single phase materials when interested in finding precise structural parameters of a material. However, since the scale factors of each phase are determined independently, Rietveld refinement of multi-phase materials can quantitatively examine the mixing ratio of each phase in the material. Rietveld refinement allows determinations of positional and thermal parameters from powder data.
- In this two-day workshop he explained every detail of Rietveld Refinement, Students of MSc I and MSc II year participated in this workshop and learned the programming of X-ray Diffraction how to obtain a graph using this software.
- The Head of the department Dr.Chandargupta Dhudhe sir on behalf of physics society facilitated him with an memento as a token of appreciation.

Biography of Dr. U. A. Palikundwar

He is Convenor at RUSA centre RTMNU and Coordinator of RTMNU OBEROI centre. He has completed his graduation in 1995 in PEM From RTMNU and post-graduation in physics from RTMNU in the year 1998.
