The main motive of this campaign was to spread awareness among the students about the significance of cleanliness and its benefits and how Unity leads to the best implementation.






WORKSHOP ON HUMAN RIGHTS ORGANISED BY GOVERNMENT OF INDIS, NEW DELHI -
